Cost/Admission Fact Sheet

This information will guide you through the admission process at FPC. Please contact us if we can provide personal assistance at any time.

Admission

To be admitted, prospective students must meet one of the following methods of admission.

High School Graduation

A graduate of an accredited high school is eligible to enroll at FPC. An official high school transcript is required and should be sent to the Office of Educational Services.

Examination

Individuals who have attained scores on the General Educational Development (GED) test which meet standards prescribed by the Texas Education Agency are eligible for admission to FPC. The passing score for GED examinations completed prior to January 1, 1997, is an average standard score of 45 on all five tests. For examination from January 1, 1997, to January 1, 2002, the passing score is a minimum standard score of 40 on each of the five tests and an average standard score of 45 on all five tests. For examination after January 1, 2002, the passing score is a minimum standard score of 410 on each of the five tests and an average standard score of 450 on all five tests.

College or University Transfer

A student may enter FPC by transferring from another college or university, provided the student is eligible for re-entrance at the last institution attended. An official transcript is required and should be sent to the Office of Educational Services.

Dual Credit Enrollment

The concurrent enrollment program allows eligible high school students to enroll in college courses while still attending high school. Contact your high school counselor for details, or contact the FPC Dual Credit department at (806) 457-4200, ext. 775.

On-Campus Housing

Students planning to live on campus should file a housing and food service application as soon as possible. Student Financial Services

All prospective students are encouraged to complete an application for financial aid. Many different types of aid are available such as grants, loans, and work study; however, the funds are limited. We recommend that students apply early to assure an award prior to registration. Applications are available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Success Initiative Program Scores

Students must file assessment scores with the Office of Educational Services prior to enrollment. Students who are enrolled in a certificate program are not subject to this requirement. Information concerning exemptions and waivers is available in the Frank Phillips College *Catalog*.
